CLUB COMPETITION RULES

- 1: All entries to have been completed within the 12 months prior to the competition.
- 2 Entries must be entirely the member's own work and not done in a class of instruction, or copied from publications or photographs taken by other people without their written permission.
- 3 Entries must be presented in a finished, dry condition, framed or otherwise finished ready for hanging, with D rings and cord, or finished in a stable mount with a rigid backing able to be supported and hung.
- Airbrushed works of art will be accepted but must be labelled as airbrush in its Medium category. If a painting is part airbrushed and part painting it must be labelled as Mixed Media/Airbrush in its Medium category.
- All entries must have the name of the member, and the category/competition being entered, securely attached to the back of the work on a swing tag long enough to go over the top of the painting and hang in front of the work. The member's name to be covered on the front, if the work is signed.
- One entry per person per category will be accepted, unless otherwise stated by the competition co-ordinator.
- 7 Members can enter in absentia if another member presents and collects their work.
- 8 All competing members must be financial.
- 9 The Committee reserves the right to reject any entry that does not meet the above criteria.
- 10: All entries will be displayed on the Society's Exhibition Screens No easels used.
- All entries are to remain on display until 12.30 pm. Artists may collect their paintings after 12.30 pm.

DONATIONS: Thank you **Liz Cross**, **Deanna Flood** and **Myra Blackstock** for your generous donations of books contributing to the collection of Great Masters, Watercolour and Chinese calligraphy.

Our library is full of DONATED books and DVD's with some new ones purchased by committees. These have sourced many hints and inspirations for previous owners, with helpful learning and techniques for their own personal art. We are now the fortunate recipients of these items, from Great Masters to today's successful international and New Zealand artists - traditional or modern. There is information on the increasing use of newly introduced mediums.

On the inside of the library cupboard doors is a chart with colour pen coded items - i.e. yellow = flowers, pink = portraiture etc. This is to enable you to quickly select a book in the category of your choice.

Also to further assist – on the shelf with the out and return files is an exercise book with copies of the catalogued lists. You could use these lists if you wish to peruse and select your requirements without being overwhelmed at the range of choice available on the shelves.

I have been asked to write a few words about a favourite artist. I have many but one lady who comes to mind is English Pastel Artist Jackie Simmonds. I have admired her paintings for many years and have one DVD of hers. The Society also has DVD's and books.

She is a wonderful Pastel Artist painting the light and the shade, painting gentle landscapes with a light touch using soft colours. Her teaching DVD's are very easy to follow mainly painting gardens and flowers in the landscape.

For the beginner she explains pastels. Types of paper are also covered so it is a great DVD for the beginners to pastels.

Her books are also along the same lines with perspective and composition included. Looking through her book I can see she has travelled to other countries to paint. She captures the feeling of the moment and where she is. Jackie Simmonds also has a very good website jackiesimmonds.com which she keeps up to date and there is also a blog.

Over recent years she has slowed down with her painting and is creating work using glass and enamel work. I don't know her age as DVD's are ageless but I believe she has developed a health problem which doesn't enable her to paint as much, hence her move to other creative pursuits.
