


PAINTING SCHOOL YEAR 2


This year the painting class has a new time slot, the first Wednesday morning of each month, starting on Wednesday 6th February, with Graham Baker.

Members can do their own painting, subject and style choice or you may wish to work through a painting of my choice with me.


Either way I will assist by demonstrating techniques as we go along. Most of you have established a base from which to start – let's bring together your own skills with a greater range of options to fortify your techniques.

Season's Greetings to you all.

Having been lucky enough to be invited to two end of year session break ups, I can recommend the company and the food at both the **Still Life Session** which from next year will be on the 3rd Wednesday morning of each month and the **Portraiture** sessions which will now be on the second and fourth Wednesday mornings of each month. The change of days has been requested from those attending and we are always willing to make it as easy as possible for members to come to the sessions.

Another **big change for 2019** will be the Painting School which will have a new Tutor and a new day. **GRAHAM BAKER** will be the Tutor for the year and the **Painting School** will be on the first Wednesday morning of each month, rather than the last Wednesday. We hope that will suit everyone.

MIRIAM RUBERL – WATERCOLOUR WORLD – becoming a watercolour whizz – Commencing Thursday 28th February and thereafter on 4th Thursday of each month. Charge of \$45 per person or \$80 for two months. Max number of 10 per session. Waiting list will be available. More details will follow in the first newsletter of the year, but generally the 10 sessions will start with the fundamentals so that everyone,

novice, initiate or seasoned painter are on a level playing field for the rest of the year. Session content will be in blocks of 2 as to content so if you feel you know enough about a certain aspect eg. composition, elements of art etc, you need not register for those.

Already booked for 2019 is **KAROL OAKLEY** for a two-day **Pastel Workshop** in March – Monday the 25th & Tuesday the 26th. We are very grateful to those that normally hold their sessions on these two days for giving up the rooms for this Australian artist who is coming to our area on these two days only.

Also booked is Val Chapman's sister **MURIEL GARTLAND**, from Australia, who will be doing a weekend **Acrylic Workshop** on the 18th and 19th of May on Seascapes. The workshop will be suitable for all levels of artists, using a limited palette. More details later.

A **Mixed Media workshop** for all levels of interest will take place the Weekend of April 13 & 14, led by Miriam Ruberl – designed to pique the interest of people new to Mixed Media, and thrill those who have attended previous courses with Miriam.

Thanking you all for your on-going attendance at the rooms. They are there for your enjoyment.

Wonderful Success at our Garden & Art Café and Exhibition

Peter and Alison Ferris again generously offered TSA a great opportunity to showcase our members' art and to convert a double garage into a Café in their beautiful garden at Matapihi. This allowed us to raise extra funds for TSA and we are extremely grateful to Peter and Alison.

After months of planning by the Garden & Art Subcommittee - Berys Suridge, Jenny Brogden, Mary McTavish, Elizabeth Cross and Wendy Fullerton - 42 artists exhibited 214 paintings. More than 850 people visited the café, garden and exhibition over the four days.

The Café was a real draw-card to the garden and was extremely popular with its variety of home baking. Grateful thanks to Margaret Hunt, Jenny Brogden, Berys Suridge, Marie Brown and Deanna Flood for a mouth-watering display of home baking, and food served with a smile and hours of hard work behind the scene. The café with its outdoor and indoor tables was a real success visually and financially.

The Exhibition was attractively presented and run by Jenny Brogden, Mary McTavish and Elizabeth Cross. Thanks to the members of the Exhibition Committee, Adrian Muller and John Cross for their help with setting up and hanging the paintings and then packing up on Sunday. 33 paintings were sold with one commission accepted; plus 10 garden ornaments of Oamaru stone were also sold.

The Murals which decorated the café walls, painted two years ago by the Tuesday morning group, the Tuesday evening group, the Thursday evening group (now the Thursday evening group) and the Thursday morning group, have now been sold, and will continue to be enjoyed by the new owners who really appreciate them.
