8.30 – 9.00 am 26 November.*** Cover your name on the front but have swing tag on the back.

### CLUB COMPETITION RULES

- 1: All entries to have been completed within the 12 months prior to the competition.
- 2: Entries must be entirely the member's own work and not done in a class of instruction, or copied from publications or photographs taken by other people without their written permission.
- 3: Entries must be presented in a finished, dry condition, framed or otherwise finished ready for hanging, with D rings and cord, or finished in a stable mount with a rigid backing – able to be supported and hung.
- 4: Airbrushed works of art will be accepted but must be labelled as airbrush in its Medium category. If a painting is part airbrushed and part painting it must be labelled as Mixed Media/Airbrush in its Medium category.

- 5 All entries must have the name of the member, and the category/competition being entered, securely attached to the back of the work on a swing tag long enough to go over the top of the painting and hang in front of the work. The member's name to be covered on the front, if the work is signed.
- 6 **One entry per person per category** will be accepted, unless otherwise stated by the competition co-ordinator.
- 7 Members can enter in absentia if another member presents and collects their work.
- 8 All competing members must be financial.
- 9 The Committee reserves the right to reject any entry that does not meet the above criteria.
- 10: All entries will be displayed on the Society's Exhibition Screens – No easels used.
- 11 All entries are to remain on display until 12.45 pm. Artists may collect their paintings after 12.45 pm.

**Please bring a plate of finger food for a lunch around midday.**

Later in the morning competition winners will be announced and a critique of the winning paintings will be given from the Judge. There will be a raffle. Help for the catering ladies, putting out food and cleaning up afterwards, would be appreciated.

As a financial member of the Tauranga Society of Artists inc., you are entitled to show and sell your art work at Art in the Park.

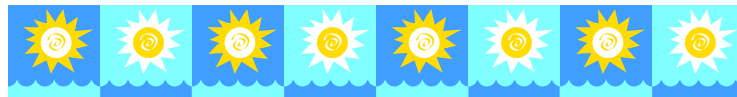

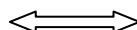

\* Draw/misc, 100/3 **THE CREATIVE WAY TO PAINT** by David Friend. (Over two months now). A newly catalogued book.

\*Watercolour/flsr500/10, **AN INTRODUCTION TO PAINTING FLOWERS** by Elizabeth Harden

Oil/Gen, 300/13 **HOW TO PAINT THE AUSTRALIA LANDSCAPE PART 1**. This book was catalogued last month

Oil/Gen300/14, **HOW TO PAINT THE AUSTRALIA LANDSCAPE PART 2** this book was catalogued last month.

***For the last few months there have been two books taken without signing them out, but always returned. This month there are five books taken without signing them out. Three of the books are newly catalogued. It is very unfair on other club members.***



### **◆ THE SYSTEM TO USE THE LIBRARY HAS NOW BEEN CHANGED.**

The new format for taking out and returning books has been made much simpler. **From now on, there will be one folder for books and another folder for the DVDs.** Books are free but **there is a charge of \$2.00 per DVD** to be left in the tin in the DVD cupboard. If you are not sure what to do please ask another member. If you need more time with a book or DVD phone Judith Robinson 572 1101. **THE SAME PROCEDURE IS TO BE USED FOR BOOKS OR DVD'S but written in the appropriate folder.**

### **◆ Checking out Procedure Books:**

- Enter your **name** in the first column of the checkout sheet in **the Book folder.**
- The next column follows with the **date OUT**
- Write the **full name of the book** into the next column.
- Followed by the **code** in the next column, (example, draw/TecT, 100/2)  
Please read the side of the book for the **CODE.**
- The book should then be **witnessed** by another club member who enters their name in the Witness OUT column.

### **◆ Returning Procedure Books:**

- When books are returned find the entry line when book was taken out
- enter the **date returned IN**
- The book should then be witnessed by another club member who enters their name in the **Witness IN** column.
- Place returned book into the return box.

◆ **Checking out Procedure DVDs:**

- Enter your **name** in the first column of the checkout sheet in **the DVD folder.**
- The next column follows with the **date OUT**
- Write the **full name of the DVD** into the next column.
- Followed by the **code** in the next column, (example, DPI,2A).  
Please read the side of the DVD for the **CODE.**
- The DVD should then be **witnessed** by another club member who enters their name in the Witness OUT column.
- Pay \$2 per DVD into tin.

◆ **Returning Procedure DVDs:**

- When DVDs are returned find the entry line when DVD was taken out
- enter the **date returned IN**
- The DVD should then be witnessed by another club member who enters their name in the **Witness IN** column.
- Place returned DVD into the return box.
