# **LIBRARY NEWS**

#### **PEN & INK**

One of the earliest surviving images of pen and ink was drawn on papyrus by a Greek artist. Pen and ink became highly developed in Chinese art using animal hair brushes. Inks first appeared in China 3000 BCE. Pen and ink became popular during the early renaissance era generally applied with quill pens. Wash and highlighting provided additional effects giving line and dimension for individuality of style. There are many examples of the use of pen and ink by 'old masters' and innovative modern artists. A particular example is Heinrich Kley, a German caricaturist, cartoonist and painter.

A variety of pens are in use today, including the Biro. However, the ink is not lightfast or permanent as with some of the Acrylic colours. Sanguine (waterproof) is a distinctive alternative to black.

**BOOKS:** There are a number of publications in the library's Drawing category, three of which I have chosen for explanation below.

#### PEN AND INK TECHNIGUES - Frank Cohan

A book with information for artists from basic to intermediate and accomplished. A wide variety of subject matter with 'know-how-to' instructions, by a teacher of pen & ink in adult-education facilities. He presents information on papers, pens, practice strokes, the grid system, and matting, with illustrations and easily followed applications.

#### PEN AND INK SKETCHING - Peter Caldwell

This too is a very informative book with inspiring, creative activities to apply to your own style and imagination. Included is the choice of sketching outdoors with a variety of pen strokes for definition. Most of the drawings lend themselves to "vignetting" or bleeding off to draw the viewers eye into the picture. (Vignette - not enclosed with a definite border.)

#### **LEARN TO PAINT PEN AND WASH – Wendy Jelbert**

Everything everywhere inspires Wendy Jelbert. This is a great book for pen and wash, predominantly with colour using waterproof acrylic inks and watercolour paints, examples of which are motivating, and simply demonstrated.

#### DVD: CREATING TEXTURE IN PEN & INK with watercolour. - Claudia Rice (part2)

If you can put up with the faulty tape for approximately 5-6 minutes, you will learn to create a cat showing stroke lines for soft fur, appealing eyes, and lastly, watercolour. Well into it, again the tape goes awry!
