A big thank you to all who have been involved and assisted with the planning and build up to our October Art Expo being held at the Tauranga Boys College Gymnasium.

There has been a HUGE flurry of activity organising entry packs, entries, rosters, payments, signage, advertising, invitations, sponsors, lighting, extra screens, flowers, raffles and a multitude of other details involving many members.

The good news is – we are feeling excited and under control. There will be:

- 299 paintings hung on display
- 68 in the Cash and Carry section (available to take away at time of purchase)
- 231 in the Red Dot section (remaining on display until end of Expo if sold)
- 60 artists have entered paintings for the Expo

We are hosting a Gala Opening at 5.30pm on Wednesday 9th to open the Expo – this will be officiated by Mary Dillon, the patron of the Society.

Invited guests will receive a specific Gala Opening invitation. They will be participating artists, local dignitaries, local business people, sponsors and other invited guests.

To promote the expo to as many groups in the community as possible, please save the attached general invitation to attend and send it to your email database (where appropriate) and SHARE on your social media pages – Instagram, Facebook. It's all a numbers game. The more people that know about the Expo, the more visitors to the Expo we get. That will result in more sales of artwork and more awareness of the presence of the Society and its members.

We look forward to a successful Expo with great outcomes.

In the words of Leila Jeffreys - world famous bird photographic artist - "Exhibitions may look effortless like a swan on a lake, but below the surface feet are paddling frantically."

The 2019 October Art Expo entries have now closed and are being processed, listed, labelled and made ready for Wednesday 9th October by the Exhibition Team.

If you have entered paintings but haven't submitted a 100-word Bio about yourself – there is still time. All artwork hanging in the main 'Red Dot' section will be hung grouped for each artist with their name above their paintings. We welcome more Bios – doesn't have to be fancy, just a bit of a story about your life in art or what you love about painting or about the paintings you have entered. We're happy to help out with wording if you want. We have extended the deadline for these until Thursday **3rd October**. Participating artists and members who are helpers on one of the teams will receive an email with roster times, instructions, and timeframes shortly if you haven't already.

Because we are doing things a little differently this Expo, please read your instructions carefully as 'pre training' before you show up on the day to do your bit.

It's really important that we all follow the adjusted processes put it place to make it all run smoothly.

For those who collected entry packs: Each entry pack had a handful of coloured flyers inside – please distribute these into letterboxes, or on notice boards relevant to you, NOW if you haven't already.

Check in for artwork is 8.30am-10.30am on Wednesday 9th October.

At check in, each artist will draw a numbered token which will give them the position number that their artwork will be hanging in.

Whilst art is being checked in the screens and lights will be set up and then the hanging teams will hang the artwork.

- 6. Cam Burgoyne Thomas Memorial Award & Keith Corner Memorial Trophy: Best Abstract (Does not depict a person, place or thing in the natural world)
- 7. Jensen Trophy: Best Coloured Pencil (no washes)
- 8. Contemporary Art Trophy: Best Contemporary Art (art of today/reflecting modern day life)
- 9. Reg Charman Memorial Cup: President's Choice "My Other Passion" theme
- **10.** President's Trophy: Best Emerging Artist "My Favourite Memory" theme (up to 2 years as an artist not just 2 years at TSA)

Please bring your paintings to the Elizabeth Street, Community Centre <u>between 8:30 & 9:00 am</u>. Remember to cover your name on the front of your work and have a swinging tag attached to the back, stating your name, the title of your work and the category your art is to be entered.

COMPETITION RULES:

- 1. All entries to have been completed within the 12 months prior to the competition.
- 2. Entries must be entirely the member's own work and not done in a class of instruction, or copied from publications or photographs taken by other people without their written permission.
- Entries must be presented in a finished, dry condition, framed or otherwise finished, ready to hanging. This requires "D" rings and cord, or finished in a stable mount with a rigid backing – able to be supported and hung.
- 4. Airbrushed works of art will be accepted as airbrushed in its Medium category. If a painting is part airbrushed and part painting it must be labelled as Mixed Media/ Airbrush in its Medium Category.
- 5. All entries must have the name of the member, and the category/ competition being entered, on a swinging tag long enough to hang over the top and hang in front of the painting, securely attached at the back. The member's signature to be covered on the front.
- 6. One entry per person / category will be accepted, unless stated by the competition coordinator.
- 7. Members can enter in absentia if another member presents and collects their work.
- 8. All competing members must be financial.
- 9. The committee reserves the right to reject any entry that does not meet the above criteria.
- 10. All entries will be displayed on the Society's Exhibition Screens No easels are used.
- 11. All entries are to remain on display until 12:30pm. Artists may collect their paintings after 12:30pm.

LIBRARY NEWS

DRAWING CATEGORY: PHOTOGRAPHS

More than a century and a half ago Turner saw some of the earliest photos ever taken, being captivated by the light and shadows. The new photography was a major influence on French artists such as Corot and Courbet too. The resulting studies of light and colour are generally considered major influences on painting today.

With a photo we can compile a series of connecting pictures as a permanent record of a subject that has attracted us to paint - light, atmosphere, bright sunlight, rain or indoors.

When painting difficult areas, such as reflections on water, photographs are invaluable. However, the down side is a flat image with too many distractions from the focus that you responded to, and with the need for rearrangement or exaggeration.

Viewfinders are a helpful piece of equipment. Enlarge your photo enough to see the detail upside down. This will help you overcome the preconception of what you think you see and focus on what is really there.

BOOKS:

• How to Draw from Photographs by Diane Cardaci (code 86)

Explanations of simple step by step demonstrations of drawing, i.e. pencil strokes and technique from photos.

• Painting and Drawing from Photographs by Ursula Kaiser (code 85) A more in-depth publication of learning techniques for most mediums with particular emphasis on photographs as a source of inspiration.

DVD:

• Painting from Photos Made Easy. Step by Step. by John Lovett

This is a 10-minute demonstration, drawing attention to special formulas of shapes, the centre of interest, using a viewfinder, simplified colour contrasts and focus choices.

AIRBRUSH

Airbrush is a particularly useful tool to tone colours, and repair or soften an area. Paint looks different when sprayed with an airbrush because as the paint dries on the paper light bounces off the applied sphere giving the area an extra glow.

BOOKS:

- The Airbrush Book by Seng-Gye Curtis & Christopher Hunt This book gives a comprehensive, detailed history of airbrush as a modern artist's tool, the art, history and advanced exercises.
- Airbrush Technique: Beyond Photography by C Michael Mette Here for beginners, basic techniques are introduced with profitable tips for the advanced. Initially, Japanese authors, illustrators and publishers were foremost in the field. As a substitute for practical training the author has interviewed a number of airbrush artists with their illustrated examples. This is a colourful fun book of "how to do it."
