If you would be interested in being involved in this let us know. See later in newsletter for more information.

We are holding this popular annual event earlier in the year than previously to take advantage of daylight saving and the warm weather.

ART EXHIBITION and TRUSTPOWER SUPREME AWARD

APRIL 23-26 2020 (setup & opening on Wed 22 April) Entries Close at 5pm on Friday 27th March 2020.

This, the Society's most prestigious exhibition, has been moved to April (from June) to host it at a warmer time of year and work in with the availability of the Tauranga Boys College venue. The Exhibition Committee is working hard behind the scenes to make the Exhibition a huge success.

The format will be the same as our very successful October 2019 Expo but of course with the SUPREME AWARD section and a few NEW INITIATIVES.

I really encourage you to enter your artwork in this well attended exhibition and participate in the set up and running of this event. Get those brushes (or pens or pastels) flying and have a go!

Artists may enter up to 5 paintings including 1 entry in the Supreme Award section. However, the entered paintings MUST fit on a 2.4m x 1.2m display screen space. You need to plan your entries so that they WILL fit on one display screen (including Supreme Award entry). E.g. you have to enter a smaller number if your artworks are large.

SUPREME AWARD: Choose your 'best' artwork and enter in the Supreme Award section (one painting per artist) This section will be judged by a significant person in our 'art world'. One SUPREME AWARD and FIVE MERIT AWARDS are selected by the judge. The winner receives the Supreme Award Trophy and will have their name inscribed on the Trophy and the plaque in the Art Room, plus a \$500 cash prize sponsored by Trustpower. The Merit Award winners receive a \$100 cash prize. Prizes are kindly Sponsored by Trustpower.

TINY ART SECTION: This is a NEW category. A bit of fun and a new opportunity for members and another point of interest for visitors.





SUPREME AWARD



Members may enter up to 3 'TINY ARTWORKS' in this new section. These (up to) 3 paintings can be extra to the 5 allowable paintings in the main section. The artworks can be smaller than and up to, but NOT LARGER than 15cm x 15cm, or 225 square centimetres. E.g. 22.5cm x 10cm, or 12cm x 18cm.

This size limitation is for the ARTWORK ONLY. It does not include frame and mat which can be over and above this size.

In keeping with the TINY theme - the title must be one word, and the price capped at \$150 - Your TINY ART can by anything from \$1 to \$150.

LIVE ART: Members are invited to participate in a roster of 'live art', i.e. we will have several locations around the perimeter of the venue where artists can work on a piece of artwork, this can be whatever medium you like to work in but a variety of mediums overall would be great. This will be an added point of interest for visitors and gives members an opportunity to talk to visitors about what they are working on and encourage new members to the Society.

RED DOTS: After the success of this system at the October Expo, it has been decided to have the whole exhibition in this system, i.e. a RED DOT is attached to sold work. The artwork remains hanging and purchaser collects paintings after 2pm on the final day of the Expo.

ARTISTS BIO: Each Artist will have a biography up to 100-words next to their artwork. Please supply this with entries, written in the first person, i.e. talk about yourself - "I began painting late in life..." rather than "John started painting late in life..." If you need help with this the Exhibition committee is happy to draft a bio for you after a chat about what you would like said.

SALE OF CARDS: The opportunity to sell prints of your artwork on cards is offered again (around 100 cards were sold at the last Expo), more information on Entry Form.

PEOPLES CHOICE AWARD: This was very well received at the October Expo and generated over 500 votes. It created a real point of interest for visitors and generated more involvement. First place was won by Natalya Doudell with 'Lost in a Dream', 2nd place was won by Patrick Gibbons with 'Storm Coming'.

GUEST EXHIBITORS:

- **Tauranga Boys College:** The Society has invited Tauranga Boys College Art Department to participate in our Exhibition this year with a section of 'TBC Boys Artwork' and awarded a separate Peoples Choice Award to this section.
- **Floral Art:** At the October expo three local florists provided beautiful floral displays that enhanced our Exhibition. This year, the Tauranga Floral Art Group have been invited to display their skills with pedestal arrangements in a theme in keeping with the Exhibition as a complementary artform.

ENTRY PACKS: These will be available at the Art Room on 4th March. Entries Close at 5pm on Friday 27th March 2020. Entries can be completed online or placed in the white box in the foyer of the Art Room prior to this time and date.

RULES FOR EXHIBITION ENTRIES

Each submitted work:

- 1. Must be the sole original work of the artist.
- 2. Must be for sale.
- 3. Must be complete and dry before delivery.
- 4. Must be insured by you. The Society offers an 'all care- no responsibility' approach.
- 5. The use of other's photo references must have written permission.
- 6. Triptychs and Diptychs can be entered as one entry, provided that together they form a complete piece and they are priced to be sold together.
- 7. Entered paintings must all fit on ONE 2.4m x 1.2m display screen aesthetically.
- 8. Enter work with mix of airbrush & traditional as mixed.

CLEANING UP THE ART ROOM AFTER YOUR SESSION
