Thank you for attending the AGM on Thursday and for the vote of confidence shown in the committee members and myself by the election of our roles for the next year.

Again, my thanks to the members who have stepped down from roles on the committee and sub committees for their service over the last year. Welcome to new committee members and existing members who have taken on new officers' roles. A complete list of those will be in the minutes of the AGM as is my Presidents Report if you are interested.

Now that Covid-19 restrictions are behind us, it is great to see more members using the Art Room. The next six months are packed with opportunity to display and sell your artwork with two competitions and two major exhibitions.



I earnestly encourage you to participate in the upcoming competitions on Tuesday 28th July (see information later in this newsletter). It's like playing in a tennis tournament – regardless of your skill level at the start, somehow you come out the other end learning and doing something better, with the satisfaction of knowing you have given it a go. There are 9 categories you can enter which are different to the end of year categories. Give it a go!

Our Art Expo Trustpower Supreme Award has been rescheduled to 30 September - 4 October. Our 12 new screens are made and 50 new lights arrived. Many thanks again to Trustpower for their generous grant to purchase a further 12 screens and 50 lights. We now have enough display space for 70 artists to have a screen (1.2mx 2.4m) each all beautifully illuminated.

The committee is delighted to announce that we are hosting our second major exhibition as part of the Garden and Art Fest. $(19^{th} - 22^{nd}$ November) We have negotiated to have a large exhibition space right in the HUB – Bloom in the Bay – at the Racecourse venue where they are expecting some 20,000 visitors. This will be an exceptional opportunity to sell artworks.

We are offering an OUTDOOR ART section - weatherproof art that can be hung on a wall or fence or tree. We are currently working on sponsorship of paint and substrate to paint on. Will keep you posted about that.

Have a great month and I look forward to seeing you at the competitions or in the Art Room. I am off to do a 'road trip' around the East Cape to the Hawkes Bay and Wairarapa then home with some friends. I am aiming to come home with lots of photographic painting inspiration.

Please bring your paintings to the Elizabeth Street, Community Centre <u>9.00am – 9.30am</u>.

Tea and coffee will be available at the Art rooms if you wish to stop and have a catch up. We will have a guest speaker.

The presentation of trophies at the Community Centre will commence at 11.30am followed by viewing of the paintings. Artists may collect their paintings after 12.30pm.

Cover your name on the front of the artwork but have a swing tag with your name, title and category you want to enter, on the back.

MID YEAR COMPETITION RULES

- 1. All entries to have been completed within the 12 months prior to the competition.
- 2. Entries must be entirely the member's own work and not done in a class of instruction, or copied from publications or photographs taken by other people without their written permission.
- 3. Entries must be presented in a finished, dry condition, framed or otherwise finished ready for hanging, with D rings and cord, or finished in a stable mount with a rigid backing able to be supported and hung.
- 4. Airbrushed works of art will be accepted but must be labelled as airbrush in its Medium category. If a painting is part airbrushed and part painting it must be labelled as Mixed Media/Airbrush in its Medium category.
- 5. All entries must have the name of the member, and the category/competition being entered, securely attached to the back of the work on a swing tag long enough to go over the top of the painting and hang in front of the work. The member's name to be covered on the front, if the work is signed.
- 6. **One entry per person per category** will be accepted, unless otherwise stated by the competition co-ordinator.
- 7. Members can enter in absentia if another member presents and collects their work.
- 8. All competing members must be financial.
- 9. The Committee reserves the right to reject any entry that does not meet the above criteria.
- 10. All entries will be displayed on the Society's Exhibition Screens No easels used.
- 11. All entries are to remain on display until 12.30 pm. Artists may collect their paintings after 12.30 pm.

Mid-Year Competitions "Judging Guidelines".

For the upcoming Mid-Year Competitions, here are some guidelines that will be sent to our judge to assist with judging. You may like to critique your own work before entering using the following criteria:

- 1 Subject relevant to the category in which the artwork is entered
- 2 Composition shows uniqueness and/or originality
- 3 Perspective good proportions and a passage for the eye to follow
- 4 Colours do they work for the subject of the piece
- 5 Tonal values showing lights, darks and transitions
- 6 Craftsmanship –demonstrates excellence and confidence in chosen medium
- 7 Is there emotional impact if intended
- 8 Presentation in tune with modern criteria and ease of display

COLOURED PENCIL

Coloured pencils have a core of lightfast pigment protectively encased in wood. A core is made of wax or oil-based pigments with additives and binding agents as included with water soluble and pastel. In the early history it is known that the ancient Greeks used wax based crayons, and it is recorded that they were also used by the Romans. The first coloured pencil appeared in the early 19th century.

In 1834 the German company Staedtler invented the coloured oil pastel pencil. Production for the coloured pencil for art purposes started in the early 20th century, the first invented and produced in 1908 by Faber Castell, 1924 Caran d'Ache and 1938 Berol Prismacolor etc. Despite coloured pencil's existence for more than a century the art world has greatly treated the medium with less admiration, even with distain, compared to other art media. However with the discovery of new techniques, methods and the formation of authoritative organisations it is now competitive.

Quality coloured pencils are a priority, soft or hard in sets or singly. They can be used in combination with several other painting media with techniques of layering, burnishing, fusing etc. The choice of paper depending entirely on subject matter and finished impression.
