FROM THE PRESIDENT

It was voted at the AGM to pay a \$300 honorarium to the Exhibition Coordinator in recognition for the effort and responsibility of the role. We have a great team of Indians to do all the jobs. If you are on a committee or not, and think you could take on that role, let me know.

Thank you to the 54 members who attended the meeting. My report has been sent out to all members, for those interested to read. It made me very proud of you all as I wrote it, accounting for all the activity and effort put in by the committees and you, to complete a very productive year in uncertain times. So what's ahead? We have started the year with a very successful Mid-Year Competitions held on Saturday 26th June.

Congratulations to all who had the ambition and courage to enter, and to the winners of the 10 trophies and 20 Merit Awards. A full report of the winners will be posted on our website and social media. This year the Dara Koru Trophy was awarded for Artistic Achievement. Kindly donated by Lynne Dara and her family. Thank you, Lynne.

It has been decided by the Executive committee to make the minutes of the meetings available to all members. This will create a transparency so you know what is going on, what has been discussed and being planned for the year ahead. The minutes will be available the month after each meeting once they are approved. I welcome any ideas and feedback that will contribute to the success of the Society from those minutes.

It has also been decided to have WIFI - free internet access - installed at the Art Room. This will facilitate members using an iPad, phone or tablet for reference material, live online tuition sessions, access to online tuitorials and much more. We have a large TV in the Art Room that was kindly donated. I'm sure this will suffice for now, but we may consider upgrading this to a 'smart' TV in the future. I will let you know when we are all hooked up and talk more about the opportunities it will provide then.

Later this year 6-10 October we will be holding our Supreme Award Expo. This year the committee is planning to have a theme for the Supreme Awards. Something that will allow all genres to interpret. If you have any ideas, we would love to hear them. This will be decided at the next meeting. Also at that Expo we are widening our reach into the community and will be inviting new guest exhibitors and hosting various workshops open to visitors. If you have any ideas of any art groups you would like to be considered or workshops you would be interested in tutoring or attending, let me know.

In later years, it was great to occasionally meet up with Joan when she attended as many Society social events as she was able, with transport help from her husband David or other family members to get her from her home in Pyes Pa.

Many of our long-time members will hold fond memories of Joan and her important contributions to the Art Society.

LIBRARY NEWS

Hi Everyone,

I have now become the art society's new librarian. Audrey has done an amazing job of cataloguing all the books and DVDs making it very easy for me to segue into the role. So, a big Thank You to Audrey Naismith.

I am an avid reader and devour books on a weekly basis. For the last five years I have been using the public library to source books on art so it feels like a treasure trove now having all these art books available for our perusal. Although we are very much in the digital age, to me there is nothing like a good book.

I have started putting a few books out each week on a particular subject to catch your eye, and hope our society members will utilise the library more. I know that I will be using these books for help with my drawing and painting skills.

We have been donated a paper guillotine by Mary McTavish. Thank you. I'm sure it will be put to good use.

Review of 3 books, just for a bit of fun:

1) <u>Why Cats Paint</u> – by Heather Busch & Burton Silver (Miscellaneous category) Feline creativity is documented in archaeological tombs. Medieval references to cats painting and an experiment in Texas in 1987 showed that cats had a distinct preference for Van Gogh paintings. I wonder why?

2) <u>How to draw Cartoon Dogs, Puppies and Wolves</u> by Christopher Hart (Draw 87) Even in cartoons the artist looks at the underlying bone structure and movement of animals and flowing lines. Floppy ears add cuteness and the eyes slightly enlarged to the proportion of the head makes people respond emotionally to the animation.

3) How to Draw Animals by Jack Hamm

(Draw 86)

How animals walk, how a horse runs impact the correctness of the drawing, e.g. the way horses' legs are used when they gallop or canter differ. Build on the simplified form of the animal and get the proportions right. Eyes, nose and ears vary in every animal and these facial features can make or break a painting.

PORTRAITURE

"If you can draw well, tracing won't hurt, but if you can't draw well, tracing won't help."

For the first session last month we had a good attendance and our male model was kindly introduced by Greg Nicie, one of our members and a keen portraitist. For the second session we did not have a model but started a series of exercises which will be continued throughout the year. I have designed these exercises to help improve observational skills and hand/eye coordination - essential components for a sound drawing technique. As the year progresses these exercises will steadily become more challenging. The first part of the exercise consisted of copying a basic line illustration of a female face using a grid. Once this was completed the second part of the exercise was to draw the same face onto a blank sheet of paper without using the grid. As the exercise progressed there was total concentration by all members and you could have heard a pin drop!

Everyone enjoyed the session and all members taking part understood the benefits of using this very basic and structured approach to improve their drawing.

softness of the pastel and the roughness of the paper to get the desired effects. Some of our members use inks, watercolours or isopropyl alcohol with pastel to create a base underpainting giving a different depth to their work. All very interesting to see and to learn how to achieve.

So it's the first and third Monday of each month – 9.30am through the afternoon. See you there.
