JULY CRITIQUE/APPRAISAL SESSION

The July 2-monthly appraisal session was led by Robin Purllant who gave constructive and helpful advice on all the paintings presented for critique - covering what he called the main "3 Cs" - Composition, Colour and Control. Robin has the canny knack of immediately identifying a "problem" area and solving it!

If using a photograph for reference in a realistic painting, Robin stressed the importance of using a photograph with enough credible information and detail. He then advised stepping back from the work and making small adjustments visually. As a result, Robin never uses photographs for his reference, preferring to use the actual objects - especially for animals and birdlife which he sketches from the Auckland Museum exhibits. Robin used his own paintings to demonstrate many of the tips and techniques he showed us and provided us with a very useful handout for self-appraising our own work.

Thank you, Robin, for a most interesting afternoon! Don't miss the next session - Tuesday 7th September at 1pm.

LIBRARY NEWS

Hi everyone,

Art in the Outback

I have just spent a month in Perth with Covid lockdown for 5 days, so an extended stay there. We went up the coast to Kalbarri and the colours of the rock, hills and canyons are spectacular with ochre's, red, orange, purple and magenta shades. I am especially drawn to the huge ghost gums and photograph the bark which has different hues of white, creams, pink, brown and deep purple. I am keen to attempt an Australian scene with all these colours. We also went to art galleries and viewed aboriginal art which I will talk about in another newsletter. I am sure we have books in our library with Australian artists that I can browse.

Review of books:

The Art of Oil Painting - by Walter Foster Publishing.

This book contains paintings from many different artists. The rich versatile art of oil painting has captivated artists for centuries. The use of vivid colours captures the impression of the subject. In particular (on pg. 83) rocks can be painted with a mix of blue-violet and Paynes grey and also raw sienna and Paynes grey using darkest colours for depth. This gives the reddish tones for painting Australian rock.

How To Paint Watercolour Landscapes - by Hazel Harrison

(WC 119)

From photograph to canvas, this book gives detailed instructions of the techniques of painting from a photo. A Utah landscape on pg. 71 caught my eye as the colours are similar to the Australian outback but not as vibrant. This landscape is more dull orange and yellow ochre.

Painting the Moods of Light - by Rachel Rubin Wolf

(WC 16)

This book showcases 9 artists demonstrating the use of light. 'Light cannot truly be seen unless it reacts with objects.' The use of light and shadow on pg. 120 shows soft diffused light to create a quiet mood. Light can be used to reflect many moods.

PORTRAITURE

"I draw like other people bite their nails" Pablo Picasso

We had a "full house" for our first July session. We did not have a model but I introduced another exercise designed to improve drawing accuracy. At our first session in July the focus was on line, proportion and the positioning of key facial elements. This month we moved on to stage 2 and our focus was on building and modelling facial features using light and dark shading.

These exercises are designed to help our members master basic drawing mediums such as soft pencils, conte crayon, pastel and charcoal. Everyone really concentrated during the session and our portraitists are finding these exercises very informative and



helpful. Consequently, their skills are continually developing and they are laying down strong foundations which can be applied to other work, whatever the medium they are working with.

We had a total of 15 pastellists arrive to work at our last session, with a few away with colds etc. so there could have been another four or five coming along. We are delighted with the winter turnout and plan some more formal sessions so that all of us can improve our techniques.
