I am so thrilled to tell you we have 80 entries, with 369 paintings, including 44 Supreme Award Entries. Well-done team. Thank you all for your enthusiasm to enter and work to create so many artworks. I think 80 entries might be an all-time record!

COVID restrictions allow us to have a gathering of up to 100 so the Gala Night has a green light. **However**, because of the restrictions, unfortunately we can't all be there at the same time. So, unlike the last few Expos when the whole membership has been invited, **this time only artists** with an entry in the Supreme Award can be invited. Other invited guests to the Gala opening will be sponsors, previous art buyers and significant persons in our art world.

Graham Crow, local and internationally recognized artist, has kindly agreed to be our judge. He will present the awards and comment on the winning artworks. Jolene James, Breeze radio announcer and Creative Communities member will announce the Supreme Award winners. Kate Symmans of Gordon Harris Art Supplies (sponsor of our People's Choice Award) will open the Expo.

I'm sorry we can't have everyone there this time... Blame Covid.

I am just very grateful that we are able to host our Expo and not have to cancel it like so many other events. My sincere thanks to the Exhibition Team for the behind-the-scenes efforts to make this happen. END-OF-YEAR COMPETITIONS

The end of the year competitions will be held on **Saturday 27th November**.

We encourage you to enter an art work / painting in this event. Below are the categories for the competition:

- 1. Marie Peters Millennium Cup: Best Pastel
- 2. Grace Walsh Trophy: Best Oil
- 3. Georgia Don Memorial Cup: Best Acrylic
- 4. Marge Martin Salver: Tauranga Scene
- 5. Caster Brothers Award: Best Watercolour (Tube, cake or pencil)
- 6. Cam Burgoyne Thomas Memorial Award & Keith Corner Memorial Trophy: Best Abstract (Does not depict a person, place or thing in the natural world)
- 7. Jensen Trophy: Best Coloured Pencil (no washes)
- 8. Contemporary Art Trophy: Best Contemporary Art (art of today/reflecting modern day life)
- 9. Reg Chalmers Memorial Cup: President's Choice "My New Zealand" theme
- 10. President's Trophy: Best Emerging Artist "My New Zealand" theme
 (Up to 2 years as an artist not just 2 years at TSA, OR an artist who has not won an Award or a Merit at TSA Club competitions previously)

Please bring your paintings to the Elizabeth Street, Community Centre <u>between 9:00 & 9:30 am on</u> Saturday 27th November.

Remember to cover your name on the front of your work and have a swinging tag attached to the back, stating your name, the title of your work and the category your art is to be entered. Also write your name on the back of the painting in case the swing tag comes off.

COMPETITION RULES:

- 1. All entries to have been completed within the 12 months prior to the competition.
- 2. Entries must be entirely the member's own work and not done in a class of instruction, or copied from publications or photographs taken by other people without their written permission.
- 3. Entries must be presented in a finished, dry condition, framed or otherwise finished, ready for hanging. This requires "D" rings and cord, or finished in a stable mount with a rigid backing able to be supported and hung.
- 4. Airbrushed works of art will be accepted as airbrushed in its medium category. If a painting is part airbrushed and part painting it must be labelled as Mixed Media/ Airbrush in its medium category.
- 5. All entries must have the name of the member, and the category/ competition being entered, on a swinging tag long enough to hang over the top and hang in front of the painting, securely attached at the back. The member's signature to be covered on the front.
- 6. One entry per person category will be accepted, unless stated by the competition coordinator.
- 7. Members can enter in absentia if another member presents and collects their work.
- 8. All competing members must be financial.
- 9. The committee reserves the right to reject any entry that does not meet the above criteria.
- 10. All entries will be displayed on the Society's Exhibition Screens No easels are used.
- 11. All entries are to remain on display until 12:30pm. Artists may collect their paintings after 12:30pm.

LIBRARY NEWS

Hi everyone,

Our Expo is getting closer. I am sure there will be a huge variety of subject matter and styles presented by all our talented artists. I have been fortunate to visit many galleries during my travels around the world and seen some amazing collections and art forms. I would like to touch on just a few different types of art from different countries and will review three books from our extensive library.

Australian Aboriginal art are highly colourful paintings. They are often based on dot patterns that tell a story of the 'Dreamtime" portraying Aboriginal spiritual beliefs and mythical creatures.

Japanese calligraphy has always fascinated me. It is called 'shodo' which means way of writing. As an art form it has been used since the 6th century and is a means of communication but also a Zen practice evoking harmony and wisdom.

Chinese people also use calligraphy as an art form. I am more familiar with Chinese porcelain using art work to decorate pieces. The decorative pottery from the Ming Dynasty often has intricate patterns and fine detail making them an exceptional art form.

Art of any form is creative and interesting but some most definitely is in the eye of the beholder!

Australian Artist Magazine 379, - January 2016

On page 68 is a painting by Anita Gerega featuring Dingoes using dots and patterns. The painting won the 2015 Sulman Prize; a subject that could be abstract or semi-abstract. The artist has captured the Dingoes using wildflowers of the Australian desert with a background of dots. It is very effective.

Illuminated Calligraphy - by Patricia Carter.

(Draw 112)

I couldn't find a book on Japanese calligraphy but found this book interesting. Design forms an essential part of calligraphy and illumination. Decorating a name or text can be creative. This book shows stylised borders of flowers, patterns and aesthetic designs to complement the writing, sometimes using gold leaf, ribbons, leaves and ferns.

Treasures of Asia - Chinese Painting- by James Cahill

(CHI 6)

This book is a potted history of early dynasties from the 2nd Century to the 18th Century. It features some hand scroll work with fine detail drawn with ink and colours on paper or silk. Many of the paintings depicted hang in some of the most famous art galleries around the world.




