ARTIST OF THE MONTH: RICHARD FENN



LIBRARY NEWS

Hi Everyone,

I have finally set up my art shed in the back garden shed. It is great to have a permanent place to paint and leave everything there instead of having to pack up. I love being out there listening to the birds and the wind in the trees as I paint. My shed is very colourful with lots of decorated boxes and old antique tins which I have collected over the years. I have been reading some books from our library about how to make colour sing and tonal and colour values; also, how to pull your painting together composing the colour mass, line and capturing the mood of the painting. I have learnt a lot from these three books that I will review.

Book reviews:

Making Color Sing - by Jeanne Dobie, AWS

(WC 37)

This book gives practical lessons in colour and design. "Colour is one of the never-ending mysteries of painting - there is always more to discover and explore." Make your paintings come alive with use of Octanic mixtures; intense jewel colours by mixing primary colours to capture the brightest burst of colour possible. Alternatively using cooler dull mixtures to create tranquil paintings or using pushpull interplay of cool and warm light.

Painting What You Want to See - by Charles Reid

(WC 39)

On page 90 are two paintings of the same subject demonstrating the use of light and shade. The author also talks about using the subject matter to create emphasis and a personal point of view. There is also advice on mixing watercolour swatches and what colours to use. Lots of information for a novice like me.

Pulling Your Paintings Together - by Charles Reid

(WC 37)

The author talks about positive and negative darks and lights, and also the values of light and shade and anchoring the composition. He gives examples of how to integrate all the elements of a painting into an artistic whole. He shares his artistic experience and all the problems, solutions and joys of creativity.

EVAN WOODRUFFE PRESENTATION - 22 FEBRUARY 2022





Do artists love art products? Do fish love water?!

Evan Woodruffe showcased a plethora of Gordon Harris' lovely products and kept us informed and very entertained all in one. He started with different types of brushes and how some can really help with the work load with blending and mark making. He liked the da Vinci Chuneo synthetic brushes, for oil and acrylics.

Golden flat paint products are new to the market and we got a demonstration of these bright colours, ideal for abstract and adding a range of textures. Golden have 5 different types of paints in their range. Flat comes forward, shiny recedes.

Different papers were explained and how to treat them, mediums, sandpaper and so much great information. Lovely granular watercolours by Schmincke were demonstrated and they produced some wonderful effects.

Have we thought about how we dispose of our paints? We must wipe off excess with paper towel, before washing brushes and palettes down drains. Liquid charcoal was so easy to use, and comes in a range of subtle dark colours, made from cherry pips, apricot stones, grape seeds etc. Did you know about vegan paint products?

Evan is a gem, and if he comes over again, make sure you put your name down.

PASTEL SESSIONS

Greetings All,

We had a very nice first group session at pastels last Monday, with just a few of the regulars turning up. However, at the art rooms we are all signing in, wearing masks on arrival and agreeing to remove them once we have established everyone is vaccinated and happy with that decision.

I tried the course that Maureen Ledgerwood sent around to us all – an online opportunity to do a 5 Day Free pastel session with Nina Squire, a UK Pastellist. I enjoyed her teaching and despite the fact that I only had half the Unison pastels that she recommended I managed to find some of my own that were very close to her colour choices and I followed along quite well, finding the on-line videos and watching the Q & A sessions later the same day.

There are probably plenty of these short courses available on-line and if they are reasonably priced or even better free, they certainly give out some good tips and techniques that probably would take years of practising to pick up on our own and here they are for nothing!

The prospect of the PANZ Convention down in Wellington this coming month hangs in the balance at the moment with Covid present and heightened restrictions etc. but we are keeping our fingers crossed. It might even happen on-line which would be better than nothing but no official announcement at this point.

I have been in contact with Creative Tauranga about the possibility of hosting the PANZ Convention here in Tauranga next year and have been to look at a couple of venues already. Still, lots to ponder over at this stage but would appreciate a group of you contacting me if you would like to become more involved with the planning and I would certainly appreciate the support.
