LIBRARY NEWS

Hi Everyone,

The Expo showcased such a diversity of art this year. I particularly enjoyed all the large art displays.

Abstract and Graffiti Art:

Recently I came across large canvases of 'graffiti' art that conveyed emotion. The raw expression of anger, rage, hopelessness, sorrow and restless energy captured my attention and has stayed with me.

These 'dark' paintings had an emotive quality that is hard to capture. Harsh black colours, bold brush strokes, red words leapt out of the canvas.

In 1930's to 1960's a movement of "Expressionism" or "Abstract Expressionism" was founded. These paintings were intense, passionate and highly personal to the artist as a vehicle for expressing their emotions.

One such artist Jean-Michel Basquiat (1960 – 1988) was an American whose paintings formed a visual cacophony of colour with primitive shapes and words expressing chaotic reality. Unfortunately, he died of a drug overdose at age 28. His paintings are still very sought after.

German artist Georg Baselitz (b 1938) also used harsh brush strokes and thick black paint. His work is aggressive and expressive with violent distinctive images. Other paintings such as Van Gogh's 'Sunflowers' (1888) depicts almost manic and agitated emotions. Picasso's 'Weeping Woman' (1937) is another example of searing grief in a disjointed way of painting.

Review of three books:

Vasarely – by Gaston Diehl

The secrets of a work of art remain to some extent unfathomed. Victor Vasarely's work integrates 'Kinetic' (energy of motion) shapes and colours in dynamic ways e.g., page 27 'Axonometric' a study of faces in a cube.

Abstract Painting – by Vicky Perry

Vicky explores concepts and techniques. The spectrum of painting runs from order through to chaos. The expressiveness of a work may develop through randomness and disorder.

The Art of Abstract Painting – by Rolina van Vliet

The skill of expression is the ability to paint ideas, feelings and involvement in things that move you, representing the mental and emotional context of a painting.

Great work everyone.

Spring Competitions: Saturday 5th August 2023

Hopefully your entries are underway and don't forget John Horton could offer advice June 27. Below are the categories for the competition and the rules:

- 1. Marie Peters Millennium Cup: Best Pastel
- 2. Grace Walsh Trophy: Best Oil
- 3. Georgia Don Memorial Cup: Best Acrylic
- 4. Marge Martin Salver: Tauranga Scene (any medium)
- 5. Caster Brothers Award: Best Watercolour (tube, cake or pencil)
- 6. Cam Burgoyne Thomas Memorial Award & Keith Corner Memorial Trophy: Best Abstract (does not depict a person, place or thing in the natural world)
- 7. Jensen Trophy: Best Coloured Pencil (no washes)
- 8. Contemporary Art Trophy: Best Contemporary Art (art of today/reflecting modern day life)
- 9. Reg Chalmers Memorial Cup: President's Choice "I'm on fire emotive" theme (any medium)
- President's Trophy: Best Emerging Artist open theme (any topic, any medium) (Up to 2 years as an artist not just 2 years at TSA, OR an artist who has not won an Award or a Merit at TSA club competitions previously)

Remember to cover your name on the front of your work and have a swinging tag attached to the back, stating your name, the title of your work, the category your art is to be entered along with the category number. Also write your name on the back of the painting in case the swing tag comes off.

COMPETITION RULES:

- 1. All entries to have been completed within the 12 months prior to the competition.
- 2. Entries must be entirely the member's own work and not done in a class of instruction, or copied from publications or photographs taken by other people without their written permission.

 Entries must be presented in a finished, dry condition, framed or otherwise finished, ready for hanging.
 This requires "D" rings and cord, or finished in a stable mount with a rigid backing – able to be

supported and hung.

- 4. Airbrushed works of art will be accepted as airbrushed in its medium category. If a painting is part airbrushed and part painting it must be labelled as Mixed Media/ Airbrush in its medium category.
- 5. All entries must have the name of the member, the category number and the category/ competition being entered, on a swinging tag long enough to hang over the top and hang in front of the painting, securely attached at the back. The member's signature to be covered on the front.
- 6. One entry per person category will be accepted, unless stated by the competition coordinator.
- 7. Members can enter in absentia if another member presents and collects their work.
- 8. All competing members must be financial by 22 July 2023.
- 9. The committee reserves the right to reject any entry that does not meet the above criteria.
- 10. All entries will be displayed on the Society's Exhibition Screens No easels are used.
- 11. All entries are to remain on display until 12:30pm. Artists may collect their paintings after 12:30pm.

ARTIST OF THE MONTH: THURSDAY MORNING GROUP

This group has painters with many different styles and passions. Some review earlier works, others create new. Generally, we review each other's work and give friendly advice, which is taken or rejected. All in all, we have fun painting. We hope you all enjoy our paintings in June.

PASTELS

How exciting to discover a new medium to paint on.....

This is what has happened within the pastel group recently. When Angela and I were down in Arrowtown attending the PANZ 2023 Convention we were treated to a great workshop put on by Australian pastel artist Stephie Clark (<u>www.stephieclark.net</u>) who regularly works on the medium Clairefontaine Pastelmat. We were all asked to bring along a couple of sheets of Pastelmat to use in our workshop sessions. What with the demand for sheets and others of us purchasing pads of pastel mat we created a national shortage!

However, once we got started on our workshop learnings, we quickly realised how much of a difference the Pastelmat makes when applying pastel to this medium. It seems like a thirsty sponge. More and more layers of pastel can be added and blended, with no loss of fingerprints in the process, quite different from the Colourfix sheets or even actual sand paper which some of us have trialled.

Not only do the sheets take an enormous amount of pastel they can be used again and again. If necessary, the pastel can be brushed off with a stiff hog brush or even washed with water and left to dry and reused again and again. Stephie's words were, "Don't ever throw away a piece of Pastelmat". Having not actually tried washing a sheet as yet, I cannot say with certainty that it is true but I am sure Stephie would be passing on information that was legitimate and quite confidently I pass this on to you.

Several of our group have been using Pastelmat for some time, but have been working away quietly without making a big song and dance about it until we came back from Arrowtown and told everyone

about it. It is not new and fairly scarce at the moment, but well worth hunting out and giving a try. We even picked up on a comment from Julie Greig seen recently on her facebook page that she has tried it and found it quite acceptable. High praise indeed!

The only downside to this amazing product is its cost. It is not cheap to buy and can be a stumbling block for some. However, it is a bit like watercolour brushes and paper. You only get what you pay for and poor quality of either brushes or paper will not give you the finish that you desire. I would suggest you try some out and find out for yourself its qualities.

Still some spaces left in the Michael and Julie Freeman workshop 7/8 October so do get in touch for more details.
