Family, friends and all helpers, from the depths of my heart, thank you for everything you do, your efforts have not gone unnoticed, and it is very much appreciated.

Raffle ticket sales were a huge success this year, so we give a special thank you to Nicci Baxter for seeking out sponsors and organising these. We are truly thankful for the generous donations of quality products from companies who support us.

Our social media, advertising and photography was well covered by Amy Earles, who has recently joined our society. Her expertise is greatly appreciated as we continue to look for ways to reach the public. Rani Dhaliwal and Joss Harris also helped with photography, so we thank all three of you for allowing the Society to use your skills. Robin Purllant continues to guide us with advertising and printing, his skills are

invaluable. Ivan Lloyd, who recently joined the committee, works in print and greatly helped us with the screens too. Marilyn Muirhead has spent hours sending out invitations and completing data entry for our society. Without you all to share the load, the exhibition would not be what it is today. Thank you for all your contributions.

Sonya Korohina, Director from the Tauranga Art Gallery gave a fabulous opening speech on Wednesday evening and then sales began. Sonya was delightful and informative. She spoke about the connection between the Tauranga Society of Artists and the establishment of the Art Gallery. I'm sure the relationship between the two will be strengthened under her leadership if her speech is anything to go by.

Many comments were made of the wonderful display of 430 paintings from 79 artists in the April Expo. You should all feel very proud whether you are an "old hand" at exhibiting, or a new beginner in entering. Congratulations to all those who sold their art, 111 paintings were sold along with several cards and prints.

We had the greatest number of entries into the People's Choice awards and it is with great pleasure to congratulate Ali Thomas who won first place with her painting, "The Concert," with 63 votes. Runner up went to Pat Elston with 41 votes and her painting of "Basilica in Venice." Both artists received a gift card from Gordon Harris to the tune of \$300 and \$200 respectively. 32 votes gained Bruce Hutchinson third place with "Cascades Te Urewera." Ruth Kenyon-Slade gained 26 votes with "Majestic Mount Ruapehu" and was selected in 4th place. Two artists with 25 votes each gained 5th equal, Lynne Dara with "Where am I going," and John Horton with "Light River Sutherland Sound." All were well deserved so congratulations to everyone. The People's Choice Award recipient for Rowena Ashman's painting went to Karen Porter who voted for one of Debbie Clarke's paintings.

I hope many of you got to go to view the Exhibition to see the fabulous artwork we show as a Society. The live art has become a popular addition over the last couple of years where artists can work and talk with the public at the same time. For those who missed out on entering in our April Expo, our next exhibition begins on the 28th September later this year. Plenty of time to get those brushes painting or whatever your medium, we look forward to seeing your work on the screens and in bright lights.

BEV MOORE WORKSHOP – 15 AND 16 APRIL REVIEW

The weekend was great from a tutor's perspective, teaching a small group of six with wonderful models aged from 11 years to 88 years. A wide range of paper, pens, pastels and different pencils were provided and artists encouraged to get out of their comfort zone. They certainly did use the opportunity to explore.

Time was spent looking at more subtle tonal values by working on black paper. This proved valuable and there were some outstanding results. Feedback has been positive with more workshops requested.











LIBRARY NEWS

Hi Everyone,

Textures:

Often art that has textures gives a more sensory experience to the viewer. Whether using organic material from nature, fabric, plaster, paper or paint mediums these can create a different dimension to the painting. Also, by using a variety of tools to create tactile paint can enhance the work.

Experimenting and developing textural effects can alter the visual outcome of the work. Due to our 'binocular' vision we are able to perceive different textures and depths of a painting. In this way we transmit sensory information at an almost unconscious level.

Review of three books:

Abstract Painting: Concepts and Techniques - by Vicky Perry

(Abs 4)

Perhaps the easiest way to experiment with different textures is in abstract painting. An artist on page 73 uses sand, wood chips, sawdust, pebbles, seeds and glitter and incorporated these agents into paint.

The Art of Abstract Painting - by Rolina Van Vliet

(Abs 17)

Different ways of using texture can be introduced at various stages, first on the support board, during the painting, or on top of the work. On the support board use paper or textiles, texture paste, gesso or sand, sawdust or plaster. In the paint layer you can add water, salt, sand, glue, bleach and work with different tools. On top of the work to make it more visual use stamps, paper, textiles, corrugated cardboard or bubble wrap.

Imaginative Techniques in Painting - by Leonard Richmond

(Abs 24)

The painting can be imbued with character by using a variety of techniques. For example, rocks need to be strong substance and striation. Clouds can be more effective by 'wiping out' paint. Using a technique of contrasting angles of firm brush strokes can display more intensity to an object or scene. Also colour vibration can be used to make a painting come alive or sparkle. There are myriads of experimental ways to enhance your work.
