Our next major upcoming event is of course the:

### Original Art Expo and Supreme Awards - 27 September - 1 October 2023.

You will have received your Entry pack by email recently. Read the information sheets carefully before completing your Entry Form. There is a lot of information about rules, presentation of your artwork, swing tags and labelling, amount of area your artwork can cover etc.

There are numerous opportunities to participate in the Expo – Supreme Award, Art Entries, Tiny Art, Live Art, and Card Sales. All entries are to be emailed to the Expo registration address on the Entry Form.



This is our most prestigious Exhibition and of course we have the coveted **Supreme Awards Competition** as part of it, generously sponsored by the Jensen Family. The Supreme Award

Competition is a showcase of the finest artwork created by members each year. It is open themed, and entries can be in any medium. Any registered member can enter **their one 'best artwork'** in The Supreme Awards. Register for the Expo and Supreme Award using the Entry Forms sent by email (some hard copies are in the Art Room foyer.) Note: Supreme Entries are hung together in a section slightly separate from the rest of the Exhibition. Your Supreme Entry will be hung with other Supreme Entries not your other artworks.

We are delighted to have Evan Woodruffe <a href="www.evanwoodruffe.com">www.evanwoodruffe.com</a> as the judge of the Supreme Awards for 2023. He will spend several hours appraising Supreme Entries to select a First Place Trophy Winner - \$1000 Prize; Runner up - \$500 Prize; and 5 Merit Awards - \$100 Prize each. Awards will be announced and presented during the Gala Opening Night (Wednesday 27<sup>th</sup> September 6-8pm). All TSA members are welcome to attend the Gala Opening along with invited guests – previous art purchasers, local art lovers, businesspeople, arts community leaders and dignitaries.

Earlier this year the Executive Team made the decision to expand our display capabilities further to accommodate more artists in exhibitions (Membership now 254) and over the last few weeks a hard-





working team of 20 members has painted and assembled an extra 15 display screens and lights that had previously been ordered, manufactured and delivered.

My thanks to those members for a great outcome.

The Society now has the resources and capacity to exhibit more artworks than ever before with 50 display screens and lights. I encourage you to enter your best artworks and enjoy the camaraderie and excitement of being involved in the largest exhibition of original artwork held in the Bay of Plenty.

Finally, I am thrilled to have completed my first teaching adventure with 12 weeks of Watercolour Discovery resulting in 15 more watercolourists in the Society. I have really enjoyed the experience with an awesome bunch of artists, and will run another course as promised. I will hold an Introductory Class in Mid - Late November and commence teaching in 2024. In the meantime, Thursday afternoons have been booked for a non-tutored Watercolour Open Studio session till the end of the year. These sessions are open to all members. The Introductory Class will be open to 15 members. More about this session later in the Newsletter.

# **Hanging Requirements for Art Expo**

The framing of your art is to enhance and finish your artwork.


- 1 If your artwork is presented behind glass, make sure it is glass. Plastic or thin perspex is NOT allowed.
- 2 Hang all your artwork with sturdy nylon cord, attached to the back of the frame with flat "D" Rings. This includes Tiny Art.
- 3 Metal hooks and rings that project from the frame and found on many ready made frames are not allowed. If you are using a ready made frame you will need to buy cord and "D" Rings and attach them as shown in the picture on the left.
- 🞙 Fill in all details about your artwork on a White Cardboard Swing tag (See image below). Print your name, title, medium and price plus your painting number eg 31B. The price must be the same as what you have entered on your entry form.
- 5 Attach the swing tag to the back of your artwork. Tie to the hanging cord with a piece of string that is long enough to hang over the top and down the front of the artwork, but not so long that it hangs below the artwork when concealed behind it. This is important for set up day. The artworks are hung with the swingtag hanging out over the front. Then the Exhibition labels are placed beside each artwork and checked against the swing tag for correctness.

We will be hanging over 500 paintings at our Expo. If the hangers have to fossick behind artworks to find the label because the string is too short, it takes a lot of extra time. It is really important that labelling mistakes aren't made and by following this process you will help ensure an efficient hanging process and that your artworks are labelled with the correct label.





"D" Rings are available at all hardware stores and are easy to screw on.



### LIBRARY NEWS

Hi Everyone,

The Expo is drawing nearer and I am using our library for inspiration on what to paint. Birds and feathers are one of my favourite subjects to paint. The myriad of colours, textures and shapes of both birds and feathers give us artistic licence to spread our wings.

The function of feathers is for flight, heat conservation, waterproofing, camouflage and display. Each feather consists of a central shaft; hollow to convey nutrients. Moving up the vane to the rachis there is an interlocking system of parallel barbs creating the shape of the plume.

Primary, secondary and tertiary flight feathers have different functions. Tail feathers are used for steering and balance and the alula and coverts on the front of the wing are used for speed and aerodynamics. Down feathers are for insulation and filoplume feathers are tiny hair like feathers that are specialised and may be sensory. Herons, bitterns and hawks have powder-down feathers which grow continuously and never moult.

So, a simple feather is quite complex to paint and the huge diversity of birds with their different body shapes, beaks and feet or claws can be anatomically challenging. Different pigments create many stunning colour palettes and iridescent colours on birds are created by light on the feathers surface structure. My favourite bird is the toucan with its large comical beak (which is hollow and very light) and distinctive coloured markings.

Many of our magazines at the bottom of the library cupboard depict beautiful bird paintings. The NZ Artist, Artists Back to Basics, Artist's Palette, Australian Artist and Plein Air magazines are available to check out.

### **PASTELS**

It's been a busy month with our Competitions Day and so many entries with new members coming through. Congratulations to all the winners of trophies and to the Merit Award winners also. I delivered the trophies to the engravers and expect to get them back to you very shortly. You will no doubt have already got them by the time this newsletter comes out. It is a great thrill to be judged by one's peers and also a great way of seeing what everyone else has been doing by way of artworks.

I wonder if, as Debbie asked, anyone will ever enter all the categories. The hard part then comes with framing and storing your works later, although they could all go into the Expos later on.

Talking of storing I have been doing some research into storing both pastels and finished works which is always a bit fraught and often costly with glass involved.

Coming to the sessions I often hear, "Well I've brought the kitchen sink with me today". Brian Frank

was a classic in this regard with both him and Adele bringing along boxes and boxes full of wonderful pastels, most still in their original sponge lined, custom made storage boxes as well as handmade wooden boxes and all in transportable, wheeled carriers. What a display they were. Different brands, different shapes and sizes. I am sure they both knew their colours and where to find them off by heart.

The pastels are generally sold in tones graded from dark to light with names often unique to each manufacturer. Cobalts, cadmiums and ochres are more standardised being the more basic, common colours, but even then the tones will probably vary. When you look at pastellists working surfaces in their studios you can see how many of them work with their colours. Some in a wonderful rainbow display of colours all loose and with no labels on them. These artists know their colours almost instinctively and reach out for exactly the one they want.

Most of us who come along arrive with a variety of containers holding our pastels. Some are plastic, some wooden and others still in their original manufacturer's boxes. There are some that have had all their paper wrappers removed and other broken in half with some of the wrapping still on the pastel. With the wrapping gone it is hard to know exactly the tone and number of each pastel but an inventory as the papers are taken off will help when re-ordering a new one.

Once the wrappings are gone it is up to you to find the right pastel for the work you are doing – a warm or cool colour, which being realistic is actually what painting is all about. So if you are happy with the wrappers gone have some fun and find your own colour palette.

Will talk about storing your finished works next time.

### WATERCOLOUR DISCOVERY COURSE WITH DEB



It has been a very successful 12 weeks of watercolour discovery. 15 members have all progressed, some from never holding a watercolour brush to having three completed (mostly) artworks.

The three overriding focusses have been:

- Learning to 'see' the colours in your reference subject.
- Managing the balance of water and pigment on your brush and the paper.
- Learning to mix or blend colours to achieve a vibrant artwork.

We have covered many techniques – (wet in wet, wet on dry, softening edges, colour washes, layering, waterdrops and more), colour theory, composition, and most importantly how to manage water and allow it to do the work. Below are pics from our last lesson.





What's ahead - I will host another group of 15 members starting with an Introductory Class on 16 November 2023. Classes will commence in February 2024 on Thursday afternoons (1 - 4 pm). I have a flow-over list from first class and will select and ballot members to join the class. This course is very focussed and attendance at each class (particularly the first 6) is important.
