### TAURANGA SOCIETY OF ARTISTS MEMBER PROFILE

#### **Robin Purllant**

Drawing and painting have always been a major part of my life. I was taught drawing privately at a very early age and when I was 12 years old, I won a scholarship to study Art at one of London's leading Art colleges. However, my parents did not allow me to take this up until I had completed my Grammar School education. I finally attended Hornsey Art College in the late 60's and spent 4 wonderful years there. The disciplines I gained, particularly in drawing and painting, have been with me ever since.

My creative life in London did not just revolve around drawing and painting. At a young age I also began to study the violin and while studying in London I was able to build on my love of classical music by hearing live all the great works performed by leading European conductors and orchestras. As a student I could get into most of the top venues at less than half price. This love of great music has been the basis of many of



paintings ever since. Even now I am working on a triptych that is based on "The Lark Ascending" by the English composer Ralph Vaughn Williams. This is a rhapsody for solo violin and orchestra - a piece I attempted to play when I was in my early teens.

During my last year at Hornsey, I was offered a position as a trainee Art Director with J Walter Thompson, the world's largest advertising agency. For 6 years I worked on Kelloggs corn flakes and Guinness. These were huge accounts, each spending millions of pounds to support their brands. Working closely with copy writers I had to create the campaigns and then oversee their production. This involved directing photographic shoots and eventually directing film productions for TV advertisements. I also continued another love of mine, which was portrait painting. These were oil portraits; all painted from life and included some famous names.

It was during this time I married Helen (a kiwi) and we decided to visit New Zealand for a holiday, and we have been here ever since. In New Zealand I continued my career in advertising as an Art director working on top accounts such as Steinlager, Montana Wines and Qantas. During my career I have won many national and international awards for advertising creativity including a New York Art directors award.

My two children were born in New Zealand. My son Jonathon now works and resides in Reading, England. My daughter Saskia is a nurse at Tauranga Hospital.

I now spend all my time doing what I love most, which is painting but I still do commercial illustrations, particularly for overseas clients. I also teach and love passing on all the tips and techniques I have acquired over the years. Drawing from life is still a very important element in my work. At Hornsey the focus was on drawing, not just to produce an accurate likeness of an object but using the process of drawing to improve and control observational skills.

I have been a member of the Art Society for 5 years and during this time I have met some wonderful artists, all keen to develop their love of painting, and I have been only too willing to help. I am also a part of the Exhibition Committee and after each exhibition it's wonderful to see the smile on members' faces who have been successful in selling their first painting.

I will always continue to draw, paint and teach. It's a passion and skill I was born with and every day I spend many hours working at either my easel, my drawing board or on my computer because I now do a lot of digital creativity. This is a skill I had to teach myself when I finally left the agency scene and worked for myself as a creative consultant.

I was born in Tauranga and have lived here throughout my life. My creativity was encouraged from a young age at playcentre and kindergarten and my earliest art memory is painting Pohutukawa flowers in the backyard when I was four. I was selected as part of the art extension group at my primary and intermediate schools, having the opportunity to paint a mural on a corner dairy and large jandals to decorate the school hall. However, I continued to work on art pieces in my school holidays and entered the Tauranga Girls' College annual art exhibitions at the Historic



Village, selling a few of my pieces over the years.

### LIBRARY NEWS

Welcome to the New Year everyone.

I bought a few of the Australian Artist and International Artist magazines at the end-of-year book sale. Although they are relatively old, they are a mine of information on techniques as well as inspiration for paintings. In the International Artist Dec/Jan 2007 I was interested in the Rainy-Day techniques with pastel, oils and acrylics as I had just completed a painting entitled, 'Rainy School Day.' The light reflections on the wet pavements all have a soft edge and capture the mood of the painting. The focus on blurred colours and soft lights enhances the reflections.

Also in the same magazine was a study of seashells. The bumps on the sea urchins and shells were applied with a palette knife by mixing the medium with titanium white.

An older version of Australian Artist, Sept 1990, gives advice on how to build up colour for ocean and waves, depths of colours and refining the highlights and reflections of the waves.

The colours of the Australian bush and trees are vibrant. Australian Artist, April 2006, specialises in the gorgeous shades of Australian gum trees. The peeling bark and soft pinks and grey/blues of the trunks are a lovely contrast to the green wattle and rivers. By varying the blue/grey under colour and different greens in the distance gives a hazy finish to the scene.

Our library is packed with magazines at the bottom of the cupboard for everyone to enjoy.

### PLANNING AND PAINTING IN PASTELS

**Tutor: Maxine Thompson** 

Maxine is a Master Pastelist in the Pastel Society of Australia and Pastel Artists of NZ with 30 years teaching experience around the world. The workshop is for any artist from beginner to experienced with demonstrations and explanations for each exercise.



### Materials you can bring or purchase during the workshop:

- 2 x half sheets or full sheets of pastel paper Canson Mi Tientes or Art Spectrum Colour fix pastel paper (mid-tone grey for exercises and any other colour that suits your subject)
  - (mid-tone grey for exercises and any other colour that suits your subject Pastels - all the hard and soft pastels you own, but NOT oil pastels
- Charcoal willow stick
- Pastel pencils black and dark brown plus any others you have
- Kneadable eraser or putty rubber
- Tape or clips
- Mahl stick

### Materials you will need to bring:

- Notebook or sketch book if you are a note-taker, plus ruler and calculator
- Any old brush to remove excess pastel dust and an old hand towel
- Backing board (600mm x 400mm for half sheet or 800mm x 600mm for full sheet)
- Name tag, first name only in capitals, large and clear

## **"LOOSEN UP" WORKSHOP**

Over two days we will consider and paint a Landscape of your choice, from distance to foreground in a relaxed loose brush style.

We will touch on creating perspective with paint, background, middle distance and foreground.

Look at composition – consider colour, light and dark, with use of limited colours or palette.

### **JUDGING GUIDELINES**

Here are some guidelines that will be sent to our Judge to assist with judging. You may like to critique your own work before entering using the following criteria.

- Subject relevant to the category in which the artwork is entered
- Composition shows uniqueness and/or originality
- Perspective good proportions and a passage for the eye to follow
- Colours do they work for the subject of the piece
- Tonal Values showing lights, darks and transitions
- Craftsmanship demonstrates excellence and confidence in chosen medium
- Is there emotional impact if intended
- Presentation in tune with modern criteria and ease of display

### **AUTUMN COMPETITIONS - DEFINITIONS OF CATEGORIES**

### 1. BEST STILL LIFE

Still Life depicts inanimate subject matter (not having qualities of active living organisms) everyday objects, whether natural objects, (flowers, food, wine etc.) or manufactured items (books, bottles, crockery etc)

### 2. BEST LANDSCAPE (including CITYSCAPE)

A work that depicts rural scenery such as mountains, valleys, trees, rivers, lakes, tidal estuaries and forests, especially where the main subject is a wide view. A Cityscape is a depiction of an urban setting such as city buildings, houses and street scenes.

#### 3. BEST SEASCAPE

Seascape includes sea with or without coastal landforms in content. It may also include boats in harbours.

#### 4. BEST PORTRAITURE

A portrait is an artistic impression of a person from waist up, in which the face and its expression is predominant. The intent is to display the likeness, personality and even the mood of the person.

#### 5. BEST PENCIL DRAWING

A pencil drawing is done on Drawing Paper and using graphite pencil. No coloured graphite pencil use allowed (i.e. no Graphitint).

#### 6. BEST BLACK & WHITE

A black & white artwork that only uses pure white and pure black or a mixture of the two. Paints/medium used must be single pigment, not a mix of more than one pigment. Note: coloured underpainting, or substrate, or framing is NOT allowed.

#### 7. BEST MIXED MEDIA

Mixed media includes any work that has more than one medium used in its construction.

### 8. BEST FIGURE STUDY

A figure study is of a human model clothed, partly clothed or nude and is a representation of the full body of the model or of parts of the model such as hands or feet.

### 9. BEST PEN & INK

Pen and ink may use ink and include a light colour wash on the paper.

#### **10. DARA KORU TROPHY**

Members eligible to enter this category are those who have NOT been awarded a TROPHY in Tauranga Society of Artists competitions in any previous competition. This does not include Merit Awards i.e. if you have won one or more Merit awards, you can still enter this category. Artist's Choice - Any medium - Any subject.

**NOTE:** In all categories 'framing' that is in anything other than the specified medium must be less than 20% of the overall artwork and must not intrude on the artwork. "Graphitint" can be used in "Mixed Media", "Pen and Ink" and the "Dara Koru Trophy."

Remember to cover your name on the front of your work and have a swing tag attached to the back, stating your name, the title of your work, the category number and the category your art is to be entered. Also write your name on the back of the painting in case the swing tag comes off.

### **COMPETITION RULES:**

- 1. All entries to have been completed within the 12 months prior to the competition.
- 2. Entries must be entirely the member's own work and not done in a class of instruction or copied from publications or photographs taken by other people without their written permission.
- 3. Entries must be presented in a finished, dry condition, framed or otherwise finished, ready for hanging. This requires "D" rings and cord, or finished in a stable mount with a rigid backing able to be supported and hung.
- 4. Airbrushed works of art will be accepted as airbrushed in its medium category. If a painting is part airbrushed and part painting it must be labelled as Mixed Media/Airbrush in its medium category.
- 5. All entries must have the name of the member, the category number and the category/competition being entered, on a swing tag long enough to hang over the top and hang in front of the painting, securely attached at the back. The member's signature to be covered on the front.
- 6. **One entry per person per category** will be accepted, unless stated by the competition coordinator.
- 7. Members can enter in absentia if another member presents and collects their work.
- 8. All competing members must be financial. Membership fees must be paid by one week before the competition to be eligible to enter the autumn competitions.
- 9. The committee reserves the right to reject any entry that does not meet the above criteria.
- 10. All entries will be displayed on the Society's Exhibition Screens No easels are used.
- 11. All entries are to remain on display until 12:30pm. Artists may collect their paintings after 12:30pm.
